Doug suggested that rather than looking at the price of the car, talk to the owners and find out about the car, ask questions about it. He said "Every car has a story." And for me volunteering this year, the third, has been a charm.

The cars on my block were BMW's owned by 3 Gentlemen and a Lady. Armed with my questions, I boldly started conversations with them and they told me about the personalities of their cars.
